
Let us continue to walk in faith together, supporting one another and growing closer to Christ through our shared experiences and devotion. Thank you for your continued prayers and support.

CENACULO 2024

ST. PEDRO CALUNGSOD ENSHRINEMENT

The Cebuano Society of Canada, in collaboration with the Filipino Ministry of the Archdiocese of Vancouver, celebrated the enshrinement of Saint Pedro Calungsod's image on April 19, 2024, at Saint Monica Parish in Richmond, BC. Archbishop J. Michael Miller, CSB, led this significant event, which was attended by hundreds of Filipino Catholics.

Saint Pedro Calungsod (1654–1672) was a young Filipino saint, missionary catechist, and martyr. Beatified by Pope John Paul II in 2000 and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012, his legacy inspires youths, catechists, migrants, and evangelists.

The mass featured various clergy, including Rev. Gilbert Nunez, Rev. Amador Abundo, Rev. Rufo Sarate, Rev. Nestor Silva, Rev. Francis Galvan, Rev. Dennis Flores, Rev. Salvador Reyes, Rev. Vicente Miguel, and Rev. Mark Bautista. The deacons present were Rev. Wilbur Victoria, Rev. Raul Abella, and Rev. Vic Gallamos.

The Cebuano Society and the Filipino Ministry expressed deep gratitude to Archbishop Miller and all participants. Sto. Niño de Cebu Anniversary Celebration

Agassiz, BC, is preparing for a special event this August - the Sto. Niño de Cebu Anniversary Celebration. This event is a time for the community to come together in faith and tradition.
